*Government Notice No. 100 of 2026*

**THE CONSUMER PROTECTION  
(PRICE AND SUPPLIES CONTROL) ACT**

**Regulations made by the Minister under section 35 of the  
Consumer Protection (Price and Supplies Control) Act**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Consumer Protection (Export Control) (Amendment) Regulations 2026.
2. In these regulations –  
“principal regulations” means the Consumer Protection (Export Control) Regulations 2000.
3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended –
  - (a) by deleting the definition of “restricted goods” and replacing it by the following definition –  
“restricted goods” –
    - (a) means –
      - (i) the goods listed in the First Schedule; and
      - (ii) for the purpose of export to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, in addition to the goods listed in the Second Schedule, the goods listed in the Third Schedule; and
    - (b) includes subsidised goods;
  - (b) by inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical order, the following new definition –  
“subsidised goods” –
    - (a) means any goods listed in the Schedule to the Consumer Protection (Control on Export of Subsidised

Goods) Regulations 2026 and in the Fourth Schedule to the Consumer Protection (Consumer Goods) (Maximum Mark-Up) Regulations 1998, in respect of which a subsidy has been granted, reimbursed, claimed, funded or otherwise applied, in full or in part, by or through the Government, the State Trading Corporation, the Mauritius Revenue Authority, or any other public body, under any enactment or scheme in force; and

- (b) includes the goods referred to in paragraph (a) which have been resold;

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting, after regulation 5A, the following new regulations –

**5B.** No export permit shall be issued in respect of subsidised goods, except where the applicant has provided –

- (a) an attestation from a wholesaler that no reimbursement or claim or otherwise has or will be applied, in full or in part, by or through the Government, the State Trading Corporation, the Mauritius Revenue Authority, or any other public body, under any enactment or scheme in force; and
- (b) any other document as may be required by the Permanent Secretary.

**5C.** Where an export permit is issued pursuant to regulation 5B, the Permanent Secretary shall notify the Mauritius Revenue Authority, or any other public body, under any enactment or scheme in force, of such permit issued in accordance with regulation 5 of the Consumer Protection (Control on Export of Subsidised Goods) Regulations 2026.

5. These regulations shall come into operation on 2 June 2026.
